












The souks of the Casablanca medina offer an authentic and vibrant experience of Moroccan life.

Located in the narrow and bustling alleys of the old town, these traditional markets are filled with shops and stalls selling a stunning variety of products.
















Founded in 859 by Fatima al-Fihri, Al Quaraouiyine University is recognized as the oldest continuously operating university in the world according to the Guinness World Records. It was established as a mosque and center for religious education and quickly became a major center for Islamic learning.

Built in the early 20th century, Bab Boujloud, also known as the Blue Gate, is not only a significant entry point to the Medina of Fez but also an iconic symbol of the city. Visitors can admire its beautiful ceramic motifs and Arabic inscriptions adorning its walls, and discover the lively atmosphere of the Medina of Fez.

The Chouara Tannery in Fez is one of the oldest and largest tanneries in Morocco, dating back to the 11th century. Renowned for its traditional leather craftsmanship, it offers visitors a fascinating experience to discover the authentic leather-making process, from the terraces overlooking the tannery.


